### Content:

A Forum is one that questions of interest will be discussed, and arrive at a conclusion that will lead onto collective action. In this Housing and Employment Forum, facilitated by May Wong (retired MCFD and CLBC social worker), parents are invited to come discuss the housing and employment options for your children with disabilities in their adulthood. The goal is to identify an organized and collective action to build a model that would better serve the needs of your children in housing and employment arrangement. We hope to form a Work Group at the end of the forum to approach funding agencies such as CLBC to find ways to realize the model that would suit the Chinese culture.
